

## EXPECTATIONS

As a Bible camp, our main purpose is to train campers in God's Word to have a Biblical world view. In addition to interesting and educational activities there are Bible teaching sessions, verse memorization, and devotions each day. Our facilities are rustic but not primitive, equipped with simple bunk-beds, indoor plumbing and air conditioning.

We have strict codes of conduct in order to ensure a safe and orderly camp experience. All campers will be required to give full cooperation with these rules and with all those in authority. No exceptions will be made regardless of any behavioral diagnosis (such as ADD, ADHD, ODD). We also ask that the camper not have any physical or behavioral impairments severe enough to prevent them from normal participation in the program. We do not provide staff professionally trained in the accommodation of these impairments.

It is imperative that you remain accessible by phone and are able to come on any given day to pick up your camper should circumstances such as behavior, illness, or injury require it.

To prevent homesickness, visits and phone calls to & from parents are allowed by director permission only. Please do not send campers with any expectation of not having to stay the full time. We urge that a week of camp NOT be their first extended overnight experience away from parents.

We are an English speaking camp. Campers must be able to communicate adequately in reading, speaking, and understanding English.

Our menu does not accommodate special dietary needs.

Snacks may be purchased at the camp store once each day but are not allowed in the cabins. Please do not bring or send gum, food, or drinks to campers.

Please do not send to camp any camper who is running a fever or may have a contagious disease.

Campers should bring any prescription and/or non-prescription medications that you think he or she will potentially need while with us. We may not have on hand medicine for every child's needs.

We have strict modesty guidelines for clothing, and they will be enforced. Specific guidelines will be sent with the email registration acknowledgment.

## COST

It is the desire of Bethel Bible Camp to offer the camp programs without tuition even though considerable operation resources are necessary. These costs are not underwritten by any organization or individual, so this can only be done as the Lord burdens individuals and churches to give towards the expenses incurred. Only a nominal \$20.00 non-refundable and non-transferrable registration fee per person, per week is required to insure a place at camp and must accompany the registration form. **NOTE: SAVE \$10.00!!!** - If your registration is postmarked **by May 31<sup>st</sup>**, you may include only \$10.00 per person, per week. Any additional funds donated are tax deductible as we are a non-profit organization. Make all checks payable to Bethel Campgrounds, Inc. Registrations must be received at least 7 days before the starting date of the week being registered for, and are accepted on a first received basis and acknowledged by mail or e-mail if provided. Please provide an email address that you regularly check and review the materials and instructions we send with it as soon as possible. **We cannot currently receive registrations by telephone or email!** When weekly quotas are filled, registrants will be placed on a waiting list and notified. Registration fees for those on the waiting list will be refunded upon request only in the event that we are not able to provide an opening for the registrant.

**Counselor in Training** June 15 - 19  
For grades 10 & up, min. age 15 (during the current year), and should have already previously attended our Discipleship Training Week. CIT registrations must be received by May 1st.

**Discipleship Training Week** June 21 - 26  
For those entering grades 9 & up, but also note that both this week and the CIT week are for participants who are already committed to be disciples of the Lord.

For boys entering grades 7 - 9.

Arrive Sun. between 4 - 4:30pm, depart Fri. at 3:00pm.  
For girls entering grades 7 - 9.

**Junior Girls Camp** Aug. 2 - 7  
Arrive Sun. between 4 - 4:30pm, depart Fri at 3:00pm.  
For girls entering grades 4 - 6.

Please plan to check in campers, with the **forms** we mail or email you, between **4 - 4:30 P.M.** Sunday (Monday for CIT Week), or your spot may be given to someone on the waiting list. **PLEASE DO NOT ARRIVE EARLY** as we will not likely be prepared to process registrations. **NOTE** that the pick up time for all camps is at **3:00 P.M.** on Friday. Please be on time.

**Registration Deadline:** All registrations must be received **at least seven days** in advance of the starting date of the camp being registered for.

**CANCELLATIONS:** Please notify us immediately if your registered child is not able to come so campers on the waiting list can be notified.

Indicate below your camper's preferences from the following available activities. (Two will be assigned according to availability.)

Air Rifles - Learn the parts, safe handling, and proper care of guns, the different shooting positions and demonstrate shooting ability.

Archery - Learn the proper care and use of bows, the various parts of bows and arrows, and gain proficiency in shooting. (Keep in mind that the bows require a certain amount of strength to draw. Very small children may not be ready for this.)

Soccer - Learn game rules and penalties, proper ball handling, and demonstrate team work and sportsmanship.

Fishing - Learn how to use and care for rod and reel, as well as how to tie on and bait hooks, cast, catch, and release fish from a stocked pond.

Handcrafts - Campers will learn various craft skills while developing their creativity. **(Not usually offered at boys camps.)**

Woodsmen - Learn how to use and care for hatchets, knives, and bow-saws. They will hike and learn to identify over 20 different trees. Also learn to tie knots, use a compass, and build a campfire.

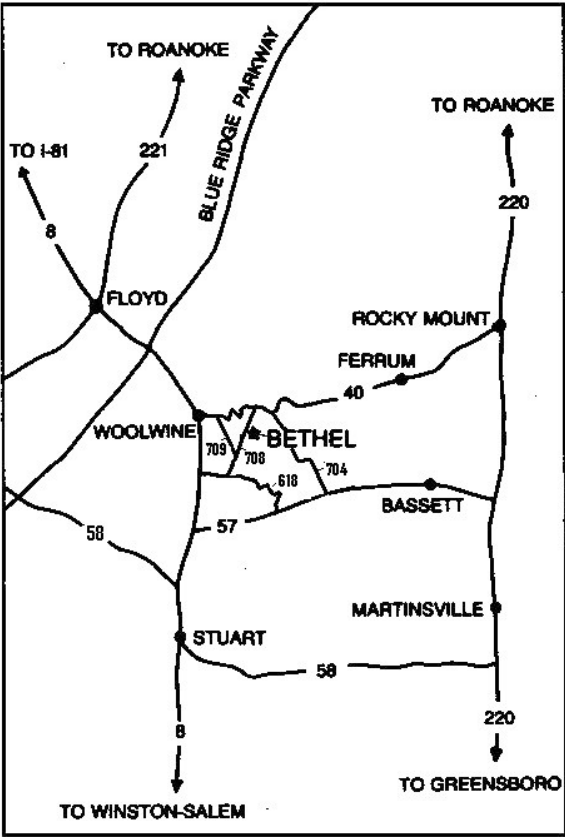
